OUR LEARNING

JUNIOR TEAM (Prep - Year 2)

All the learners in the junior area are looking forward to Jules, the school production. They are so excited to share all their hard work with their family and friends. The Prep - year 2 learners have been practising to deliver an amazing show. We cannot wait to share it all with you! Last Friday all the learners enjoyed grandparents day. They loved spending time and completing the activities with their grandparents and special friends. The junior area is beginning to explore different countries and cultures around the world. We are beginning to look at America. They have identified America landmarks such as The White House and the Empire State Building on a map. They are learning to read maps to identify different places around the world. The Prep- Year 2 learners will be comparing similarities and differences between America and Australia. The Prep learners are continuing to use their prior knowledge to help them visualise within Reading groups. The Prep learners are to write biographies. They are beginning to understand the purpose of biographies and some key features. The Prep learners are continuing to ask yes/no questions. They are learning to gather and collect data to create bar graphs. The Year 1 learners are writing letters, before they begin to explore autobiographies. They are focusing on the comprehension skill of retelling during reading. During Numeracy the Year 1's are exploring chance and data.

The Year 2 learners are writing descriptive text where we are reading longer sentences and finding joining words to make better sentences. In maths they are revising their counting and place values.

SENIOR TEAM (Year 3 - Year 6)

Year 3/4 learners have been reading information texts with a 'PIE' to identify the author's purpose. Learners have been writing acrostic poems. In Mathematics, learners have been creating graphs. They have been reading and comparing the data presented on graphs.

In Year 5/6, learners have been exploring shape and measurement. They have been learning a variety of poetry in reading and writing.

Tips for Learning to Embrace Failure in Kids

Often failure can be seen by children as being 'the end of the world' or sometimes 'losing is not an option' and can be hard for them to deal with.

Approaching this as a parent can be difficult. Supporting and teaching children how to

It is important to remind your children that failure is one of the many things we experience in life.

1. Be a good role model

Your children are always watching you. Handle your own disappointments appropriately. Don't get mad or angry, accept the disappointment and acknowledge that you can do

2. Normalise failure

Let your children know that they will experience failure sometime during their life. It is not something to be scared of

3. Give feedback after failure, ask specific questions and encourage learning What can be learnt from the failure? Ask questions such as; "How did you feel when that happened?" "What could you do different next time?" Failure is an opportunity to learn.

4. Encourage your children to try new things and activities
By sticking to "what they are good at" and not trying something new, it is hard to identify strengths and weaknesses. It is important for your child to try new things and activities, to broaden their horizons, to experience failure and to continue working on strengths and

5. Manage expectations of plans

7. Manage expectations of plans
Plans such as play dates can get cancelled and children may 'bomb out' on a test that
they planned to do well on. Treat plans as possibilities not guarantees. This reduces
expectations and allows your children to understand that minor disappointment and failure will happen in life.
