## WELCOME TO WEEK 6

Thank you to everyone for such a smooth and positive week of remote schooling. We problem solved ICT issues, irregularities and ensuring we all had what we needed to fulfill our roles. I have received nothing but gratitude and acts of kindness in support of the great lengths the staff are going to during our Remote schooling 2.0. This is not at all our preferred way to operate and I believe that as a community we have all become accustomed at making the best out of a challenging situation! Thank you for recognising the hard work of all of our staff - it is extremely affirming and appreciated at this time.

Just a reminder that all school devices are only to be used only for school learning and tasks. No outside apps, games or extensions are to be downloaded to these devices. It is an extensive task having devices realigned for onsite use and we ask that they remain for St Mary's educational tasks only. Headphones are a necessity during this style of teaching for school and home. Please be sure that your child has headphones for either school or home as it minimises background and screen noise to allow optimal learning to take place.

On Thursday and Friday's we have our Learning conference sessions with our teachers. These sessions are supported by two staff to meet child safe standards. These sessions have been planned by the teachers to target learning. These are not parent supported sessions or time to communicate with our teachers. We welcome our parents support in ensuring your child is on for their timetabled session as the teacher will have prepared 1:1 learning for your child. If you need to communicate with your teacher please use the various modes available.

As a result of returning to Remote schooling, St Mary's will be crediting every child \$50 in fees due to the limited ability we have to conduct incursions and excursions. We hope families find this a relief. Jenny Barry will either credit your fees or return \$50 per child to those who have paid all fees. If any family is experiencing financial hardship as a result of Covid #19, please do not hesitate to contact me in regard to fee support.

While in remote schooling, St Mary's is still obligated to track and monitor attendance. To do this we require all learners to be online at 8:45am on Google MEET. It is a legal requirement that we are able to account for everyone each school day. If your child is going to be absent it is the parents responsibility to please inform the school. This can be done via; PAM, School stream or call the school. Our admin staff will follow up if we have not been made aware by 10:30am. Thank you for your cooperation on this in these challenging times.

# OUR LEARNING

## JUNIOR TEAM

What a fabulous week our junior learners have had! You all continue to amaze us with your dedication to your learning. This week the Junior school has been focusing on identifying the main idea in a text. The learners have made connections to their lives by identifying the main idea of their favorite movie or TV show. In mathematics the Year 1 and 2 learners have been busy completing their unit on money. The prep learners have completed their unit on sharing and have completed their pre assessment in length.

All junior learners have been participating in problem solving activities such as subtraction and adding verbal action stories. This week the Junior learners have been busy experimenting with light and shadow. They made peek boxes that allowed them to experiment with how light works. You have blown us away with your knowledge and understanding of light and shadow. Well done to all our learners this week, you have all been amazing!

## SENIOR TEAM

Remote Schooling in the Senior school is absolutely phenomenal! We continue to show that we are independent, resilient learners who always strive to reach our learning goals.

The Year 3/4 learners have thoroughly enjoyed putting on their Science 'hats' to explore the concepts of transparent, translucent and opaque light. In Reading, learners are gaining confidence when 'reading between the lines' to infer character traits and emotions with evidence from the texts we are reading. In Mathematics this week, all Year 3 and 4 learners will be building strategies and automatic recall in the learning area of Subtraction.

The Year 5/6 learners have transformed into scientists and have explored reflection, refraction and illumination! They have created videos and posters to show their understanding of each concept and modelled their own science experiments.

In Literacy, learners are digging deeper into poetry and created a figurative poem about their favourite place in the world. We also analysed shape poetry to investigate the different features. In Mathematics, learners are developing multiplication strategies and expanding their vocabulary!



## PIE DRIVE

**Encouraging your Child to ask for Help**

Children can sometimes find it hard to ask for help. Here are some ways you can encourage them to ask for help.

**It's Okay**

Let your child know that it is okay to ask for help and that it is normal to need help sometimes. Don't view help seeking as a failure.



**Understand**

Show that you understand that it can be hard to ask for help. Don't minimise their feelings. Let them know that you care.

**Be Positive**

Respond positively when your child asks you for help. Give them your full attention. Try to help them but also teach them too.



**Role Model**

Everyone needs help sometimes. Recognise when you're not managing and ask for help.
