

JUNIOR TEAM

The learning that we have been see is amazing. You all continue to blow us away each day. Well done to all of you on another fantastic week of remote learning.

This week the junior learners have been learning to recognise facts in an information text. They have been using these facts to make a fact file. This will support our learners in writing an information report.

In maths the junior learners have been focusing on measurement. They have been learning to use informal units of measurement to compare the length of objects within their house.

This week in Inquiry the junior learners have begun to explore the different types of sound and how sound is made. They have been on a sound hunt and sorted the items they found into loud, soft, high and low sounds.



SENIOR TEAM

In Year 3/4 our learners are digging deeper into the texts we are reading through inferring what the text may be telling us but the author hasn't directly put in their writing. Learners are using lots of Information texts about sound to identify the main idea in texts with supporting details. In Writing, we are continuing to write our own information reports. Learners are building in the structure and features of information reports into their writing. In Maths, our Year 3 and 4 learners are continuing to build their skills in the area of subtraction with automatic recall of basic facts and other written strategies. In Inquiry, our learning is centred around our big question "What is Sound?" with learners experimenting with different materials to 'see' and 'hear' sounds.

The Year 5/6 learners are investigating renewable and nonrenewable energy. Learners created their own scientific research by creating a Water Wheel and Solar Cooker. We are practising drawing scientific diagrams by learning about complete electrical circuits. In Literacy, we created an info-graphic using Canva and explored scientific vocabulary. In Mathematics, we are expanding our understanding of multiplication by learning the process of the Vertical Algorithm. In flexible learning, learners loved the opportunity to design different science ideas and created hands-on mathematics resources.

WHAT IS ENERGY?
A lot of the energy that we use today is made from Non-renewable resources like coal, oil and gas which is bad for the environment because of pollution. We need to use more Renewable resources than Non-renewable!

Renewable	Non-Renewable
A renewable resource is a resource which can be used over and over because it is replaced naturally. These items are air, water, solar energy, the sun, wood and more!	These Non-Renewable resources are coal, oil and gas but there are a lot more some of the items can be used in factories or shops! The resources were made from plants and animals that have died over millions of years ago!
Now people are making renewable energy from solar panels, wind turbines, wind mills, water wheels and only from the environment!	Non-Renewable resources are resources that can not be replaced naturally and will eventually run out and these resources may be needed for more important things in the future!

Maintaining Wellbeing in Primary School Children during COVID-19



Follow you kids cues

Listen to your kid's voice and their concerns around COVID. Be honest with them and answer in an age appropriate way. It is also important to correct misinformation and not promote fear or anger about the situation.

Help your kids play their part

Kids like to help and be a part of something. If you teach them that they can do their part by washing their hands, social distancing and following the rules they may be more likely to be proud of their efforts and feel like they are helping.

Build a routine

School is a really structured environment and kids take regular breaks. This helps kids focus when they are working. Build a routine that works for your household and allow the kids downtime, playtime and food breaks.

Praise effort

Learning comes from trialing things and making errors as much as it does from getting things right. Let your kids know you are proud of their efforts even if they don't get it correct straight away.

HOW TO WEAR A MEDICAL MASK SAFELY

Do's →

- Wash your hands before touching the mask
- Inspect the mask for tears or holes
- Find the top side, where the metal piece or stiff edge is
- Ensure the colored-side faces outwards
- Place the metal piece or stiff edge over your nose
- Cover your mouth, nose, and chin
- Adjust the mask to your face without leaving gaps on the sides
- Avoid touching the mask
- Remove the mask from behind the ears or head
- Keep the mask away from you and surfaces while removing it
- Discard the mask immediately after use preferably into a closed bin
- Wash your hands after discarding the mask

Don'ts →

- Do not use a ripped or damp mask
- Do not wear the mask only over mouth or nose
- Do not wear a loose mask
- Do not touch the front of the mask
- Do not remove the mask to talk to someone or do other things that would require touching the mask
- Do not leave your used mask within the reach of others
- Do not re-use the mask

Remember that masks alone cannot protect you from COVID-19. Maintain at least 1 metre distance from others and wash your hands frequently and thoroughly, even while wearing a mask.
