I firstly want to thank you all for your ongoing support, flexibility and gratitude for St Mary's given these schooling conditions. It has not been an easy journey and family co operation has made such a difference. Yesterday the Victorian State government made some announcements that affect our schooling as we finish this term and begin term 4. Next week is week 10 and the last week of term. On Friday 18th September St Mary's will now have a closure day to allow teachers to prepare for returned face to face teaching in week 2 of term 4. There will be no school for any learners on this day. Thursday 17th September will be the last day of flipped and flexible learning for this term. There will be no 1:1 learning sessions with children on this day to accommodate our parent / teacher learning conversations.

As per the Victorian State government guidelines, St Mary's must continue to offer remote schooling for week 1 of term 4. All learners will return to face to face schooling as of Monday 12th October. In week 1 of term 4, teachers must teach remotely. We will roll over our onsite learners timetable from this term to week 1 of next term to accommodate our essential families. If any families have changes to their circumstances, please inform Miss Spence via email. On the Thursday and Friday of week 1 no one to one learning conversation will be held to allow teachers further preparation time to return to face to face teaching.

On our last day of term we will host our annual Footy colours day! Please dress up in your footy team colours! These might be our local or AFL teams that we barrack for! For onsite learners please feel free to bring along a gold coin donation for the research for childhood cancer. There will also be an option to make a donation via CDF pay from this Wednesday. Thank you in advance for this.

This Friday night St Mary's is having a community movie night for all of our families! A time to stop and just be together! A small treat will be provided to every family with some movie recommendations for your family to enjoy! We wanted to thank you all for everything you have done to support the school during Remote Schooling 2.0! Our movie packs will be distributed among the community from Tuesday this week. 

OUR LEARNING

JUNIOR TEAM


Well done to all Prep, year 1 and year 2 learners on a fantastic week of remote learning. Your enthusiasm and passion for learning continues to amaze us!

This week the junior learners have been busy collecting facts about animals. They have collected facts and details to create a fact file to support them in writing an information text. The preps, year 1 and year 2 are continuing to learn how to recognise the main idea in a text.

In mathematics the junior learners are learning to measure items through length, capacity and volume. This week the learners made playdough and measured their ingredients. They then used the playdough to measure the length and to make 2D shapes. The learners have been busy learning to recognise and describe the features of 2D shapes.

In Inquiry, the learners have been learning about sound and how their ear works. They have completed a number of experiments using vibrations and sounds waves to recognise how sound travels. The junior learners are able to describe and explain how the ear works and can define sound.




SENIOR TEAM

The Senior Learners continue to surprise their teachers each day with their creativity, independence and dedication towards their learning. We are excited to see our 'Remote Science Fair' evolve over the next two weeks as our learners dig deeper into their inquiry investigation.

In our Year 3/4 virtual learning spaces, our learning is focussed around our Inquiry 'online' Science Fair with our reading and writing program supporting our individual Science Fair experiment or model. In Maths, our learners are continuing to delve into different strategies to solve addition equations while learning new maths vocabulary - what amazing mathematicians they are!

In the Year 5/6 virtual classroom, our learners have drafted facts to write an information text on a global or local solar farm, hydroelectric plant or wind turbine farm. We continue to develop our multiplicative thinking and can even apply the complex Lattice Method to solve problems! We are creating 3D diagrams and experiments for our Science Fair and recording our progress using a science journal. Congratulations to Harry Link who has successfully created an amazing wind turbine that generates electric energy to light up a globe!




