Are you interested in learning how to play netball?

Are you primary school age?

At Leitchville Gunbower, we have two programs to suit everyone.. NetSetGo & Mini's.

NetSetGO is our beginner program, suitable for girls and boys aged between 5 and 9. it will be run on either Thursdays or Saturdays (home games only), depending on our coach. This is most suited to players who have had limited or no experience with netball and who want to learn the basics (throwing, catching, shooting and footwork). This is delivered using a structured program and is the first step in learning how to play netball. There is very limited game play in NetSetGO until players have learnt the basic skills. Cost is \$89 which includes some NetSetGO merchandise

Mini Squad (previously called Development squad) is our next program for girls and boys aged 9 to 12. Mini's will be playing most Saturday mornings and will follow the football draw (so yes, there is travel involved). Mini's will train on a Thursday night and will build on the foundations from NetSetGO. Players will learn netball playing positions and will have game play each week. We have locked in coaches for Mini's- Emily Hay & Zazney Ellwood who are taking on the coaching roles for this vital link, preparing our juniors for when they step up to competitive netball in Under 13s. There is no scoring in Mini's however there is an end of season Lightening Premiership. Cost is \$110 which includes VNA and player membership.

Here are instructions on how to register..

- 2. go to the right hand side and select 'Actions' and "register'
- 3. select participant
- 4. check personal details, then scroll to the bottom of page and click 'NEXT'
- Go to organizational name and type in LEITCH. this should be enough to bring up Leitchville Gunbower
- 6. the LGFNC colorful logo will appear.
- 7. Click on the empty box just below the LGFNC logo
- 8. this will take you to the membership details page
- 9. select player membership
- 10. select registration division JUNIOR
- 11. click 'add competition & membership'
- 12. check and add additional personal information
- 13. click 'add competition and membership'
- 14. total payment should appear.
- 15. tick the box to say that you have read and understood T&C
- 16. click the button near the credit/debit card
- 17. enter payment details and submit
- 18. you will then receive a confirmation email








MENTAL HEALTH AND WELLBEING KEY FACTS
