As we prepare for the Easter Season let us remember:


Faithful God, Jesus gave us the gift of his own Body and Blood that we might have food to sustain us.

Wow week 9!

In the Junior School this week we have been discussing our emotions. We have been exploring different emotions and what they look like, sound like and feel like and linking them to the Zones of Regulation.

We all shared a meal together this week to symbolise The Last Supper. We learned about the events that happened at The Last Supper and spoke about the connections to Mass.

In the Prep room learners have been learning about the letters 'm' and 'r', the sounds they make and what they look like when written.

In the Year One room learners have been focusing on the diagraph 'ck' and adjectives and nouns. In Maths, they have been practising addition.

In Year 2/3 learners have been focusing on narrative writing and have begun planning our own narratives using the 7 story elements. Learners have been practising their phonemic awareness by making rhyming words and linking facts and details in their reading. Learners have been practising making and expanding numbers using MAB.

The holidays are fast approaching.

What a wonderful week we have had in the Senior learning spaces.

We had 3 learners represent the school at the Zone swimming sports on Thursday and should be proud of the efforts.

Learners looked at different emotions and role played these emotions in small groups. It was wonderful to see the learners mixing with learners outside their friendship groups. All the learners stepped out of their comfort zone to express emotions without speaking.

In Maths, we are exploring time and being able to convert 12hr and 24hr time. Some learners will be looking at Secondary School timetables and this will provide them with insight into what to expect when they go to Secondary School.

The Senior learners received their pre- assessment for 'Time' back and were able to analyse their areas of strength and an area they would like to learn more about. It was great to see the learners' reflecting on what they already know and where to next for their learning.

It was great to see so much orange on Friday for Harmony Day. The learners began the day with a Smoking Ceremony and Liturgy. It was wonderful to hear the purpose of a 'Smoking Ceremony' and having all the learners involved. The learners participated in a range of Harmony Day activities organised by the teachers. It was great to see all the learners supporting one another across all year levels.

To be apply for a Get Active Kids voucher your child/dependant must be:

- aged 4 to 18 years
- a resident in Victoria
- named on a current (at the time of your application) Australian Government Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, and
- named on a valid Australian Government Medicare card.

You can apply for more than one voucher if you have multiple eligible children or dependants.

You must apply separately for each child/dependant.

If you don't have an Australian Government Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card you may still be eligible for special consideration.
