WELCOME TO WEEK 6

This weekend we began the season of Pentecost - the coming of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit - "Paraclete" has two meanings - "comforter" and "advocate"; they express what the Holy Spirit is for Christians. Pope Francis called for unity in the church and rejection of the ideologies "that divide and separate us," as he celebrated Mass in St. Peter's Basilica on the feast of Pentecost. He told believers worldwide that "the Holy Spirit is telling the Church that today is the time for comforting."

Thank you to all of our families who made arrangements for Friday to allow all staff to take part in our annual Spirituality day. The staff truly enjoyed the experience and learning. 


St Mary's acknowledges and pays respects to the traditional custodians of the land on which we meet: the Barrapa Rappa People, and pay respects to elders both past and present.

WOW half way already!

We hope you enjoyed the extra day off last week and are well rested for another busy week of learning.

Learners in the Junior School have begun focusing on their final product for our Australian history Inquiry this Term. In Year 2/3 the learners have chosen a topic to focus on and have begun researching facts and details for their information reports, which will take shape in many different forms. This week they will begin researching using out essential questions to guide their research to link with our classroom inquiries. The Prep Ones have been learning all about significant people over the past few weeks and will begin focusing on their favourite to form their individual inquiries.

In individual classrooms:

In Year 1 this week in reading we are focusing on developing our comprehension skills through unpacking our weekly text. We wrote a recount of our weekend on Monday for writing and have been continuing to work on our 'sizzling starts' for our Narratives. In Maths we have been exploring fractions which we have loved! We have had another sensational week in Year 1 and have all been putting our best foot forward!

We have had a busy week in prep this week testing our reading. We are all showing great improvement. The Preps are challenging themselves with their M100W words and are enjoying the opportunity to watch their little character shoot up the M100W ladder. We are so proud of ourselves!

2/3 's have been focusing hard on writing information reports last week about the world wars and have found lots of interesting facts while doing so. In Maths we have been practising our multiplication and division when warming up our brains for Maths making groups of using arrays and dots. We have moved on from Addition to Subtraction and some learners have been focusing on the count up to count back strategy whilst others have been practising their vertical algorithms.

Senior School Team

We are halfway through the term. Time is flying. We hope you enjoyed the long weekend.

Learners have begun to plan and research their question for their Inquiry investigation. They have created subheadings to match their investigation question. Learners will use their research skills to gather information about their selected topic and create a final production to showcase what they have learnt.

In Maths we are starting to focus on subtraction and using a range of strategies to support learners with solving subtraction equations. Learners will be split into group across both the year $\frac{4}{5}$ and $\frac{5}{6}$ learners space to target their needs and focus on where to next for their individual learning. Learners have been focusing on timetables during our warm up for maths and each learner has an individual times table goal they are focusing on during our timetable warm ups.

In reading we are continuing to focus on Australian History and Abogiringal culture to a line with Reconciliation week coming up and our Inquiry Investigation. Within guided reading learners are focusing on literal and inferred comprehension questions and going beyond the text and thinking about what is the author trying to convey.

In P.E learners have been learning a class dance with the help from Bek Sherlock. Each class will have their own dance and these will be shown at the end of the term. It is great to see so many learners stepping out of their comfort zone and trying something new.
