PAM: Parent Access Module	 This private intranet provides each individual child with an account Each family is provided with a username and log on PAM shares a weekly organiser of events and daily requirements PAM also provides access to school policies & procedures, calendars, school links, newsletters and Parent Notified Absence Parents can access their individual child(rens): attendance records, school reports and update medical records at anytime Attendance of injury or illness will also be logged on PAM and families will receive an email St Mary's requires that all families complete their child(rens) medical records annually on PAM
Email	 Group email is used to circulate whole community documents eg: the newsletter On occasion the email will be used for unexpected reminders
SMS	SMS is used to inform parents of awards & special roles for assembly
'All About Us' Information Booklet	 The All About Us booklet provides general information of how the school operates This document can be accessed on the website or from the front office All Prep families are provided with this booklet on enrolment
St Mary's Facebook Page	 Facebook is used to promote and market the school Community events and announcements will be shared here
School Surveys	 At varying times throughout the year parents are invited to complete surveys Surveys are shared digitally & invite parents to share opinion on initiatives & strategies to further school improvement
Parent Discussion Forums	 Parent discussion forums are meetings with the Principal / Leadership / School Board will occur at various times throughout the year These events are small gatherings that invite parents to share informal feedback on school goals, directions & initiatives
Paper Correspondence	St Mary's aspires to be paperless & environmentally conscious. Minimal paper will be sent home

Mode of Communication	Purpose of Communication
1:1 Meetings (<i>Ph: 5456 2062</i>)	 Parents are welcome & encouraged to contact the school office or teacher to arrange mutually suitable times for meetings. 1:1 meetings are preferred to discuss any concerns, issues & changes to an individual's information.
Email	 Parents are welcome to email teachers for minor communication and operational content. All teachers will provide their school email addresses at regularly times throughout the year. Emails are checked and responded to within 48 hours, Monday - Friday. St Many's staff will actively use emails between the hours of 8am - 6pm, Monday - Friday during school terms.
Seesaw	 Seesaw provides parents / families with regularly insight and information about life & learning at school. Each year level has a Blog that can be accessed by families with the QR access code. 3 posts will be made weekly. Seesaw journals will celebrate and share the individuals learning journey at school. This page belongs to the individual learner & progresses annually. People with access to journals are the teacher, parents / family members who have the QR code from the primary carer. 1 teacher & 1 learner post will be made weekly.
Curriculum Newsletters	 A curriculum newsletter is provided at the beginning of each term & provides families with insights to key learning, dates, events and year level based information. Curriculum newsletters will be sent home in paperform and shared on Seesaw
Formal Reports	 Two formal academic & social reports are provided for each learner twice yearly Reports are sent home in June & December All learners reports are accessible on individual PAM accounts.
Learning Conversations	 Learning conversations are scheduled in week 9 or 10 of each term Parent & learner attendance is encouraged Bookings are made online @ School Interviews
Parent Information Sessions	 Parent information sessions are scheduled at various times throughout the year The purpose of these meetings is to provide parents with general information about the class / school routines & procedures At times these session may have a community focus Eg: Learning strategies & supports, school improvement
Learning Expos	 Learning Expos celebrate the terms learning journey & achievements Learning will be shared from a class & individual perspective Parents & family members are encouraged to attend
Special Events	 Individual classes may host special events throughout the year to link a learning occasion with the community Individual class events will be shared on Seesaw
School Assemblies / Masses	 School Masses are held approximately once a month & are hosted by an individual class, parent attendance is encouraged School assembly shares & celebrates the learning that is occurring at school Assemblies will be hosted by individual classes throughout the year Assemblies are scheduled for the last Tuesday of each month from 2:20pm - 3:00pm & are currently held in the church Awards are given out at assemblies - parents are notified via SMS if their child is receiving an award

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Smart Device Safety Tips

With so many smart devices now available, it is more important than ever for you to be monitoring your children's safety when online.

Some smart devices include:

- Computer
- •Google Home
- •Laptop
- •Smart Watch
- Mobile phone
- Smart TV













1. Talk openly with your child about their online activity

As soon as your child begins using the internet talk to them about what sites they are using – decide what is appropriate for yourself and your family. Remind them that what they post on the internet is not private.

2. Keep devices where you can see them

You can set your device to 'forget Wi-Fi password' so your children have to ask for the password and you will know when they are online. Come to an agreement that devices cannot be used in bedrooms.

3. Know your parental controls

The SafeSearch Filters feature on Google will block sites with inappropriate content. To turn it on, go to Settings/SafeSearch Filters. Paid options are available for better protection.

4. Teach your children to keep their location private

Public location is available on almost every app, even when you take a photo on your phone it stores the data of where and when it was taken. Location can be turned off by going to settings, then privacy, then location services.
