Jorji - 1st in Breast Stroke & 3rd in the relay


Mackenzie - 4th in the relay

Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF)

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card you may be eligible for CSEF.

The annual CSEF amount per student is \$125 and is paid directly to the school. Applications for 2019 are now open and will close on 28th June 2019. Application forms have been sent home to all families today.




Collection of Parent Information
