OUR LEARNING

JUNIOR TEAM (Prep - Year 2)

The Prep – Year 2 learners are continuing to explore numbers through addition and subtraction. The Preps are continue to recognise the value of numbers to 20 and we are practicing to count in order. The Year 1 and 2 learners are beginning to explore the structure of a narrative. They have been creating plans for their stories. The Prep learners have began to write their recounts. The Preps are enjoying learning to write. The Prep- Year 2 learners have began to create a poster, video or slide show on area of safety. They are working in small groups to complete their research project.

SENIOR TEAM (Year 3 - Year 6)

Learners have been working hard on their Inquiry advertisements this week; they are up to script writing and will be filming before the end of the week! Very exciting! An invitation will be sent out soon for parents to come in and view the finished products. In maths, learners have been refreshing and learning strategies to enable them to solve addition problems correctly, such as the split strategy and vertical addition. Learners are also continuing to practice their mental addition and subtraction skills.

Board Chair Report

Good evening everyone and welcome to our Annual General Meeting for the St. Mary's school board. A special welcome to Ashley Marsh who is an Educational Consultant from CEO, and new board members for 2019, Tim and Emma.

The year 2018 marked an amazing year for our school and its Board Members as it was a year of challenge, reward and celebration. As a Board we continued our growth and strived for excellence for our Students, Staff and Community.

This is my fourth year on the School Board, this is also the first year I have had the privilege of Chairing the Board, and I thank you all for trusting me in this position. This year we were happy to welcome new board members Nerissa Nicholson, Rob Merkel and Ben Appleby to join existing members Jasmine Ryan, Adelia Muldoon, Ian Trevena, and myself. We were also thrilled to finally welcome Father Novie as the new Canonical Administrator in May.

As the School Board, our role is to be a consultative and advisory body for the school community, with specific responsibility for strategic planning, support to the Principal, giving informed advice, school renewal and development and defined areas of policy. School boards should be open to broad membership including people of varying gifts, skills and faith backgrounds and we are lucky enough in our school community to have this diversity.

Throughout this year the Board has assisted Jasmine with a number of projects, policies and procedures including:

- Review of the Vision and Graduate Outcomes of the School's strategic plan;
- Discussion around Working With Children's Check and St. Mary's School Volunteer Audit and the schools compliance with Child Safe's compulsory minimum standards;
- Assisted in the setting of the School Fee's & Collections Policy;
- Reviewing and implementing marketing strategies for increasing future enrolments with promotional film added to website;
- Revision of annual action plan;
- Assisted with Complaints and Grievances procedure;
- Participation in 2018 Leadership review with Catholic Education Office;
- Perhaps our biggest and most exciting challenge of 2018 was working towards getting a Minor Capital Works grant to move forward with our Master Plan. After years of building plan reviews and brainstorming this vision for St. Mary's we were successful in getting a grant in June after an earlier unsuccessful attempt, and began immediately working with our architect to get the ball rolling with tender applications. Tender applicants were narrowed down to one for commencement of building stage 2, which would see the beginnings of a new admin block and indoor toilets for the learners. A refurbishment of the current admin block to create new learning space for our growing student population will hopefully go ahead after a second successful grant is applied for later in the year. Building was to commence in March 2019 and I wish you all well with the remainder of this process.

As this is my last year as a Board Member of St. Mary's, I would like to thank the School Community for the opportunity to be involved with the School Board. It has been my privilege to work with and get to know so many committed people whose singular goal is to provide care, support and a quality catholic education to our children. I know you will all continue the good work being done to nurture our wonderful School Community.

I would like to thank our Board Members for the time they volunteer which makes St. Mary's School Board a continued success. Thank you for your dedication, contribution and tireless efforts this year and St. Mary's look forward to your continued support.

On behalf of the Board, I also want to sincerely thank the P&F Committee for their hard work. Your role is an important one in that it helps to develop a culture of parents as partners in your child's education. Your work also builds a sense of community in our school.

To the team of highly motivated and well respected leaders, teachers and teaching assistants guiding our students, who's focus is solely on the education and wellbeing of our children, thank you sincerely on behalf of the Board and the St. Mary's community.
