# OUR LEARNING...

#### **JUNIOR TEAM (Prep - Year 2)**

This week the Prep – Year 2's have been exploring the second essential question. We have been defining and creating expectation of collaboration. We have been breaking apart what collaboration means to us. Each learner is creating expectation and rules on how we will collaborate with our peers. We have learnt that collaboration is learning as a team to solve problems and complete tasks. Prep is finishing their unit on subtraction this week. We have been using the count on strategy and count all to help solve subtraction equations to 10.

Prep are in the process of writing a procedure text on how to brush your teeth. Year 1 are continuing to explore fairy tales in preparation for book week. They are continuing to look at the characters and settings of the text. Year 1 are beginning to explore shapes and their features. Year 2 are continuing to publish and illustrate their narratives and are continuing to build on their knowledge of addition strategies.

#### **SENIOR TEAM (Year 3 - Year 6)**

In the year 3-6 learning space we have completed our narrative in preparation for the book parade. We are getting ready for Book Week next week. In the Year 5/6 learning space they have been focusing on division and completing assessment tasks to show their understanding. In Inquiry learners have been looking at the different roles required to make a movie and how it comes together, they looked at the Making of Snow White to assist with this.

In the Year 3/4 learning space, we will begin to look at our 'Book Week' books 'Hansel and Gretel' and 'Jack and the Beanstalk' in shared reading and compare characters and their traits. We are also focusing on verbs and using full sentences when answering questions. The learners are enjoying learning about 2D and 3D shapes and being able to make different shapes.



#### Going to the Dentist doesn't have to be expensive!

Many children will be eligible for up to \$1000 FREE dental every 2 years under the Child Dental Benefits Scheme (CDBS). If your family is eligible for Family Tax Benefit A this is a good indication you will be eligible.
