OUR LEARNING...

JUNIOR TEAM (Prep - Year 2)

The Prep - Year 2 learners enjoyed the book parade and had a great time watching everyone in their costumes. The Prep- Year 2 learners have now completing Inquiry as individual classes. We are beginning to plan and create our performances to be presented at the end of term. The Prep learners are continuing to develop strategies to share between groups. This week the prep learners are being exposed to persuasive text. We are looking at different ways that text try to persuade us. The Prep learners have been writing opinions about why they think dogs are better than cats. The Year 1 learners are continuing to explore shape. They are exploring the features of 2D and 3D shapes. Year 1 is beginning to write scripts during writing. Year 2 are finishing off measurement and area within numeracy. The year 2 learners have been looking at readers theatre.

SENIOR TEAM (Year 3 - Year 6)

In the Year 3/4 learning space, we have been 'reading between the lines' to find the author's purpose. We have been identifying the setting in fiction texts and how this can affect the plot. In mathematics, we have continued our learning about 3D shapes using lots of mathematics words to describe them. Learners have been enjoying their 'Blast Off' multiplication challenge and reaching a personal best. In Inquiry, learners have been working collaboratively in groups to begin preparing a performance of our fairy tales "Jack and the Beanstalk" and "Hansel and Gretel." Learners are very excited about showing different ways to express themselves in our performances!

In Yr 5/6 they have started preparing for their end of term performance for Inquiry. They are focusing on a fractured version of 'Snow White'. In Maths they are learning to create equivalent fractions through the use of puzzles. In reading they have been looking at a range of different multimode text and for writing they are collaborating to write an information text about a music genre. We are all looking forward to Athletics Day on Thursday!
