Family Violence Support

Last week on Monday 25th of November was the official launch of the annual Gannawarra Goes Orange campaign, which aims to put a stop to family violence in Gannawarra.

Statistics show that family violence rates are higher in regional and rural areas. Rates of family violence also increase during times of financial and mental stress.

Statistics show that family violence rates are higher in regional and rural areas. Rates of family violence also increase during times of financial and mental stress. 222 family violence incidents were reported in Gannawarra in 2018 which has increased from 180 in 2017.

Family violence can involve one of or many of the following:

- Physical abuse
- Verbal abuse
- Controlling behaviour • Sexual abuse • Emotional abuse
- Damage to the home
- Financial abuse
- Follow and stalk • Produce fear



Family violence is often hidden, and victims/survivors can feel very vulnerable. It common for victims/survivors to reach out to family or friends. If you or someone that you know are experiencing family violence there are many support services available.

There is financial support up to \$20,000 to support victims/survivors of family violence. Contact the services below for more assistance.
