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OUR LEARNING

JUNIOR TEAM

This week the Prep, Year 1 and Year 2 learners have been learning to recognise, order and add Australian coins and notes. The years 1 and years 2 learners have been learning to add coins and notes to buy items. While the prep learners have been learning to match coins and notes with their written value.

The junior school have all been busy publishing their narrative. They have been busy typing and illustrating their stories. We are so excited to start writing information text about light and sound.

In reading, the prep learners are learning to recognise, read and write rhyming words. The year 1 and 2 learners have been building their knowledge of phonics and apply this learning to their writing. All junior learners are continuing to identify the main idea in a text.

This week the junior learners have begun their investigation on light and sound. This week they looked at sound and created cup phones. They quickly learned that you had to hold the sting tight to be able to hear. Well done to all our learners, you have blown us all away with your wonderings.

SENIOR TEAM

The Senior School has been tuning into their new inquiry by showing their prior learning using a graphic organiser, creating wonderings and engaging in different learning experiences. We look forward to making connections in Religious Education and looking at Jesus being the light of our world.

This week in the Year 3 and 4 learning space this week, learners are using the actions, facial expressions and words of characters to help them infer the emotions that characters may be experiencing. We are continuing to build our skills in the area of addition. In Inquiry this week, we are investigating our eyes and how they work to help us see. In our Religion learning, we are unpacking the scripture from Luke 8:16-18 "The Lamp under the Container." Learners have been exploring the bible and how to find scripture within the bible.

This week Year 5 and 6 learners have been exploring metaphors and similes in poetry. We created our own simile poem to describe ourselves and loved publishing it using Google Documents. We are growing our mental mathematics of subtraction fast facts and enjoying our new flash card game. We have used flipped learning to grow our understanding of the subtraction algorithm. We enjoyed being blind folded and guessing and describing what item could be in our hands. It was a great eye opener to the importance of light in our world to see. We look forward to discovering how the eye works.
