JUNIOR TEAM

This week the Prep, Year 1 and Year 2 learners have been loving attending the pool. They are enjoying participating in swimming lessons and have learnt a lot.

The Junior learners have published their digital portfolio. They have learnt to collaborate, problem solve and think critically as a team to draft, create and publish a digital portfolio of their year.

The Junior learners are continuing to revise questioning, identifying the author's purpose, recognising the main idea and connections within the text. They are continuing to build on their understanding of the procedure text and their structure.

The Prep learners have completed their unit on measurement. They are beginning to revise number, place value and data. The Year 1 and Year 2 learners are exploring chance and location. They are learning to give and follow directions to places around the school. The Year 1/2 learners are learning to recognise the likelihood of events. They have been busy playing greedy pig.

SENIOR TEAM

Term 4 is just floating by. Our swimming program is off to a fabulous start and our learners are completing many learning tasks using their flexible learning grid.

The Year 3/4 learners are exploring different Christmas stories and creating our own Christmas Journeys through imaginative texts. 




























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Positive messages for children during Christmas
