Week 1 done!

In the Junior School we sure have been busy bee's this week completing lots of learning. We have had school photos, first rotation of specialists for the term and our inquiry launch. We had so much fun dressing up and learning many new things about Australian history and how life has changed over time.

This week in Year 2/3 we have been practising our counting strategies in Maths. Counting forwards and backwards from any starting number by 1's, 2's, and 10's and all learners have been practising their individual learning goals within counting. In Literacy we have been learning about comparing and contrasting differing perspectives of settlement and focusing on short vowel sounds. We also went to the Church and created artworks of our perspectives of St Mary's Immaculate Conception Cohuna Church.

This week in Year 1 we have continued to focus on addition in Maths. We have been applying all of our knowledge of adjectives, nouns and verbs in reading while also learning the strategy Tryin' Lion. Learners have loved being back in our classroom and have had a sensational start to Term 2!

Prep this week focused on counting backwards! Jasmine set us a challenge and we are determined to succeed!

We are making connections when we are reading. We learned we could all make connections to The Very Hungry Caterpillar because we have all been very hungry before, some of us even hangry!

Welcome back to Term 2. It is wonderful to see all our learners happy and ready to learn. They have had a busy week 1 with School Photos, Inquiry launch and some class assessments. Learners have enjoyed seeing their friends and catching up what happened on their holidays.

The Inquiry launch was a lot of fun with a range of learning experiences that provide learners with a taste of Australian History. Learners participated in a range of activities from making butter, gold mining to bush dancing. It was great to see them step out of their comfort zone and participate in the activities.

The Senior learners have completed some maths assessments with a focus on addition and subtraction. In mathematics we will be developing our understanding about addition and subtraction by making connections, using a range of strategies and algorithms to support their learning.

In writing the senior learning will be exploring persuasive writing. They will look at the structure and identify key language that needs to be included to make a strong persuasive piece of writing. They will continue with 'writer's notebook' which is independent writing for the learners. They are able to select their own prompt for their writing.

During sport time learners will be developing their skills for football, netball or T-ball. This is in preparation for the Good Samaritan Cup and Lightning Premiership. Our Year 6 learners are showing excellent leadership skills with support learners through a range of activities that are helping to develop these skills.


