#### **Junior School Team**

Wow week 5! The term is humming along nicely. This week in our classrooms we are extra busy due to the short week. We had so much fun last week dressing up in the halloween theme on Friday and celebrating our Grandparents for Grandparents day. The learners loved going off with their Grandparents on the amazing race themed treasure hunt around Cohuna!

This week in th Prep/1 Collaborative classroom we have been enjoying exploring the different eras of music in our Inquiry "How is Music powerful?". We are continuing our learning with our unit on Division by partitioning numbers and Division in maths. In reading we have been reading the book "Musical Markus" read by Jimmy Rees which is closely linked to our inquiry. We are also writing and publishing an information text about our favourite artist!

In the 2/3 Collaborative we have been continuing our inquiry learning this past week by focusing on breaking open our second essential question: How does music communicate a cause or message that is important to people? We are exploring emotions and the meaning behind song lyrics. In Maths we have begun our unit on Measurement and have been comparing lengths and learning how to use a ruler correctly. We are continuing our vocabulary learning, building up our suitcases of unknown word knowledge, practising using chunky monkey, inferring and our phrasing when reading.

Week 6 and we are half way through the term!

This week we are so excited in the 2/3 Collaborative classroom to celebrate and wish our Year 3s good luck for their participation in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

#### **Senior School Team**

Hard to believe we are already in week 5.

What a wonderful week we had having a full week with all learners onsite. It was so nice to have the senior classrooms filled with laughter and learning.

We had a busy week completing maths assessment in readiness for our unit on Measurement. Learners will be grouped based on their results to target their needs.

We are continuing to learn about text responses and the key features. Learners will continue to learn and respond to different texts written and verbal.

Learners have been looking at different styles of music, how music is created in certain movies and how it can make us feel. Learners have created their own wonderings about music and will begin to investigate their question or wondering.

In Religious Education learners have been exploring the birth of Jesus and how all the people in the birth had a role to play. They have compared songs and videos by identifying what is the same or different.

In P.E learners have been learning about bowls. They are consolidating their skills through a range of activities. Learned enjoyed the challenge of trying to get the bowl to land on the line. They were able to identify if they needed to increase or slow down their bowl. Learners are able to try different pece to see the outcome. These kites are going to help us to reach our fundraising goals by raising money for the Leitchville Pre School, and by supporting us you can have your own gorgeous kite for only \$20.


