I hope that all learners and families were able to enjoy the weekend after our first week of schooling. I know for myself, it is always a tough transition from late nights and sleep-ins during the holiday period to setting an alarm and getting up at what feels like 'way-too-early o'clock!'

Thank you to our families who understand the COVID management practices we have in place at St Mary's, and thank you for playing your part in keeping our school as COVID safe as it can be. I don't envy any parent who has to carry out a rapid antigen test on their child twice per week. Thank you also to parents who are keeping their sick and symptomatic learners at home (even those learners who test negative to COVID in the morning). As a community we have to remain vigilant in this area. Any learner (or staff member) at school who is showing symptoms of being sick or ill (headache, coughing, running nose etc.) will be sent home.

Last week staff enjoyed meeting their new classroom learners and have begun setting our school expectations. As many of you are aware, at St Mary's we follow a Positive Behavioral Interventions and Support (PBIS) approach where learners focus on respect for self, others and the environment. Our current PBIS focus is around how we behave when going to the toilet. We will continue to focus on different areas of the school as the term progresses.

We all enjoyed our Inquiry Launch last Friday. As I moved around the school, I saw students dancing, sticking their hands in 'mystery boxes', listening to inspirational speeches, creating catapults with marshmallows and skewers and moving cotton balls by blowing through straws! These activities (and many more) were designed to excite and engage students in activities that required the use of our school dispositions. We look forward to continuing our learning around "What makes an effective learner?"

Parents and guardians will soon receive an email from teachers, inviting them to our Parent Information Night. This invitation will be in the form of a Google Meet link. I know staff are looking forward to this night and learning more about the learners in their classrooms. This night will begin at 6:30pm.

And finally, our new staff have written a short piece introducing themselves (see below). We look forward to the relaxation of the current COVID restrictions (as early as Week 5) and meeting our families in person.
