# WEEK 11 - ENJOY THE BREAK!

Last week our Grade 6 learners enjoyed their first transition day at Cohuna Secondary College. These days are important in providing a smooth transition to high school for our senior learners. On Friday the Grade 5 learners led our school assembly. We thank Miss Toll and her class for their preparation and leadership.

This Tuesday night, staff will meet to plan the term ahead. We are currently creating our new School Strategic Plan with a focus around learning and teaching, pastoral wellbeing and parent re-engagement. Following Tuesday night's meeting, I will share key dates for Term 2 with families. We already know that Term 2 will be another busy term, with a lot crammed into 9 weeks. This Wednesday learners and staff from St Patrick's Pyramid Hill will join us at school to celebrate our term of learning at our Learning Expo. Throughout the day, different year levels will showcase the learning that has taken place over the past 11 weeks. There will be a sausage sizzle available at lunch for those interested - orders can be made through the canteen portal (CDF Pay) but must be placed by 12pm tomorrow - Tuesday 5th April.

On Thursday we will celebrate Fr Novie's final Mass in our parish before he moves on to Echuca. Mass begins at 12:30pm and it would be great to see as many families as possible at the church to farewell Fr Novie and celebrate Term 1 at St Mary's. Later that night (Thursday 7/4) we will hold our first annual St Mary's Cohuna Fishing Competition. The event will begin at 4:30pm at the Apex Park in Cohuna and finish up with a BBQ dinner and prizes at 6:30pm.

This Friday (8/4) is our final day of Term 1. To celebrate the term, learners are invited to wear casual clothes. School will finish on this day at 2:15pm.

On Monday 25 April the community of Cohuna will celebrate ANZAC Day. Our learners have been invited to join in the ANZAC Day parade and march. If your child/ren are interested in doing so, they are to meet in their school uniform outside the Post Office at 9:15am. We will have a school wreath to lay. Please join in this day if you can. We will celebrate ANZAC Day at school on Wednesday 27th April with a ceremony at 10:30am. All families are welcome to attend.

Lastly, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the St Mary's School community for welcoming myself, Georgia and Patrick into the town. Cohuna already feels like home and we look forward to getting to know everyone better as time goes by.

Please note: If you child is absent and has a canteen order placed, please contact the school before 11am on the day so we can cancel this order.


## PBIS


