Blessed are you, Lord our God, in all your creatures! Amen.









This week I am happy that I started my trifold in Inquiry. By Macey


This week I really enjoyed specialist sport with Miss Adams, playing lots of fun games and my favourite was Farmer Sam. By Jaida



Prep Grade Health Assessments: All parents/guardians of Prep grade children will be asked to complete a Health Questionnaire and return the form to the school before June 16 th . If you do not wish your child to be seen by the school nurse, please sign the non-consent section and return the form to the school.

Referrals (Grades 1-6): Parents and/or teachers may refer children from any grade for assessments of vision, hearing, basic speech, physical abilities, medical conditions, behavioural and parenting issues. Please collect a referral form from the school office. Completed forms are to be handed into the school office prior to June 16 th, 2023. Should parents wish to have an interview with the School Nurse, please indicate your request on the form.
