Week 3 has arrived and here comes the good weather (later in the week). It is shaping as another great week filled with excellent experiences for our learners. Sunday's Gospel (Mt 22:1-14) about "Who is inviting to the wedding" provides an insight into the inclusive way Jesus lived his life. He often ignored social boundaries of the time by being attentive to those who were normally shunned. This story allows us to reflect on the people in today's society who are 'left out' and challenges us to reach out to them in their time of need.

Today we welcomed the Leitchville Kinder crew, including their 3 and 4 year old groups, for a 'School visit'. It was also the beginning of our PSG meetings. Tomorrow we have our Breakfast program again to start the day (also on Thursday mornings). The Yr3/4s will lead the parish at Mass on Wednesday from 12:30pm, all are welcome (however, our Yr3/4s are the only grades from school attending this mass). On Thursday (and every Thursday) Mrs Fry will host Playgroup from 10-11am - please invite any young families (with kids under 5) from the community to attend. We will conclude the week of Friday by sending four Yr3-6 cricket teams to Swan Hill to compete in the Cricket Blast - good luck teams!! And our 2024 Preps will attend their 2nd Transition day.

In order to ensure we are well planned ahead of the 2024 school year, we will have a pupil free day on **Friday November 24th**. Staff will be onsite for a day of strategic planning, however no learners are to attend school on this day. We apologise for the inconvenience this 'pupil free day' will cause some families.


