Flying Doctor School Dental Program

The Flying Doctor Dental team will now be visiting St. Mary's in August or September to provide FREE dental check-ups and education about healthy teeth and gums. Please be aware that this dental check-up is a basic evaluation and does not take the place of a full comprehensive dental examination. If you would like your child to have a dental check-up, please complete the consent form which will be sent home shortly, and return it to school. After your child's check-up, the dental team will send home a report. If your child requires follow-up treatment this will be stated in the report. The mobile public clinic will be in town shortly after and your child can have their treatment completed at no cost, or you can visit your nearest public or private practice. Senior School Team

It is hard to believe we are approaching the halfway mark of Term 3, and it is going to be a busy second half of the term- Athletics carnival, Learner Spirituality Day, Book Week, Year 5/6 camp, and Arts of Show for the Year 3/4 learners who elected to work with Mrs. Jodie on this. The Year 5/6 camp permission has been sent home, please make sure you read this carefully and contact your child's teacher with any questions.

In the classroom, the senior classes have been learning about landmarks in Inquiry, and locating different landmarks on the world map. Year 5/6 learners are deepening their understanding of landmarks and their significance to different cultures around the world. In Religion we have continued to learn about the Sacraments of Initiation. We congratulate the learners who received their First Eucharist and Confirmation over the weekend.

In Writing, we have been putting the finishing touches on our Book Week narratives ready for judging during Book Week. The Year 5/6 's have been revising the different uses for apostrophes in writing, and applying these correctly in their writing. In Maths, the Year 3/4 's have been completing their pre-assessment on division, in order to know what they need to learn in this area. In Year 5/6, the focus is on multiplying whole and decimal numbers, as well as converting between fractions and decimals to represent the likelihood of events occurring.

Celebrating the 35th Anniversary of the iconic Australian Picture Story Book 'Animalia'

In conjunction with this year's Book Week celebration, primary school students in Gannawarra are invited to take part in a drawing competition to commemorate the beloved book 'Animalia', a beautifully illustrated book by Graeme Base that endures today.

We would like students to re-imagine their favourite page from the book. Whether you stick to the traditional 'Graeme Base illustration style', or create a manga version of the page, the hand drawn illustrations must reflect the original material.

Entries can be A4 or A3, are to be hand drawn and **MUST** include the boy that pertains to this quote —

*"A final word before we go;
There's one more thing you ought to know;
In Animalia, you see,
It's possible you might find me."
(Ask an adult at home or librarian about this feature of the book)*

Entries will be divided into three categories – Prep/1/2, Grades 3/4 and Grades 5/6. Two prize winners will be selected from each category.

Winners will receive a SPECIAL EDITION commemorative coin, celebrating the anniversary of the publication of the story, PLUS two mystery titles of other Graeme Base books.



Entries can be delivered to either the Cohuna or Kerang libraries and must include the full name of the child, grade level and school they attend and a contact phone number. Please do not place personal details on the front of pictures.
